Investigation of photo-induced chirality in chalcogenide phase-change memory materials

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It has been recently observed that a mirror-symmetric circular dichroism (CD) signal can be induced in amorphous and originally achiral pure and doped Ge2Sb2Te5 (GST) thin film materials by crystallising the materials using left or right circularly polarised light [1].




Figure 1. Double CD spectra for amorphous and crystalline N-doped (left) and pure Ge2Sb2Te5 (right) films induced using right circularly polarised light (R-CPL) and left circularly polarised light (L-CPL).

Since the first observation of the phenomenon in GST thin films the signal has been increased by over two orders of magnitude through optimisation of film deposition and parameters of laser illumination, Figure 1.

We will discuss recent results of the studies with possible implications for increased information storage capacity, chiral sensors and metamaterials.
